CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY POLICY

OF

ARMSTRONG ROBOTICS & TECHNOLOGIES PRIVATE LIMITED (Formerly Known as Armstrong Machine Builders Private Limited)

Corporate Social Responsibility ("CSR") is defined as the integration of business operations and values, whereby the interests of all stakeholders including investors, customers, employees, the community and the environment are reflected in the company's policies and actions.

Any Organization operates in Social Environment and the Corporate Social Responsibility ("CSR") is the ways and means through which the Corporate can repay the Obligations which the Society has made by contributing the resources in its various forms as required for the efficient operation of the Business. Corporate Social Responsibility is strongly connected with the principles of Sustainability and Social Welfare. An organization should make decisions based not only on financial factors, but also on the social and environmental consequences. Therefore, it is the core corporate responsibility of Armstrong Robotics & Technologies Private Limited to practice its corporate values through its commitment to grow in a socially and environmentally responsible way, while meeting the interests of its stakeholders.

This Statement demonstrates commitment of Armstrong Robotics & Technologies Private Limited to Corporate Social Responsibility through which the company aim to align business values, purpose and strategy with the needs of the society as a whole in which the Company operates, whilst embedding such responsible and ethical principles into everything the Company do.

Guiding Principles:

"Armstrong Robotics & Technologies Private Limited" is vigilant in its enforcement towards corporate principles which the Government of India has mandated through Companies (Corporate Social Responsibility) Policy, 2014 and is committed towards sustainable development. The company endeavors to make CSR a key business process for sustainable development. It constantly strives to ensure strong corporate culture which emphasizes on integrating CSR values with business objective. It also pursues initiatives related to quality management, environment preservation and social awareness.

Definitions

- **Board** means Board of Directors of the Company.
- Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) means and includes but is not limited to: -
 - 1) Projects or programs relating to activities specified in Schedule VII to the Companies Act, 2013 or any amendment, modification, clarification thereof made by the MCA from time to time; or
 - 2) Projects or programs relating to activities undertaken by the Board of Directors of the Company in pursuance of the recommendation of the CSR Committee and approved by the Board as per this policy.

- **CSR Committee** means Corporate Social Responsibility Committee constituted by the Board pursuant to section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013 and rules made there under.
- Company means Armstrong Robotics & Technologies Private Limited.
- **Net Profit** means the net profit of the Company as per its financial statement prepared in accordance with the section 198 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other applicable provisions, but shall not include the followings, namely: -
 - 1) Any profit arising from any overseas branch or branches of the Company, whether operated as a separate company or otherwise, and
 - 2) Any dividend received from other companies in India, which are covered under and complying with the provisions of section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013.

Words and expressions used in this policy and not defined herein but defined under the Companies Act, 2013 or rules made there under shall have the same meanings respectively assigned to them.

Commitment

The Company is committed to:

- Continuous improvement in our Corporate and Social Responsibility (CSR) strategy.
- Encouraging our business partners to strive for matching performance.
- Acting in a socially responsible way.
- Supporting a number of local communities and social / charitable causes.
- Continually improving our performance and meeting all relevant legislation.
- Encouraging our staff to be mindful of the effect of their actions on any natural resource.

Purpose and Aims

- The purpose of the policy is to make clear to all stakeholders what we mean by CSR and how we propose to work towards achieving it. The CSR policy applies throughout all the activities undertaken in the organization and governs our approach to all our activities.
- In implementing this policy we aim to:
 - **&** Be responsible.
 - **&** Be an exemplar of good practice.

Eligible Areas of CSR under the Companies Act, 2013

- (i) Eradicating hunger, poverty and malnutrition, promoting health care including preventive health care and sanitation including contribution to the Swach Bharat Kosh set-up by the Central Government for the promotion of sanitation and making available safe drinking water.
- (ii) Promoting education, including special education and employment enhancing vocation skills especially among children, women, elderly and the differently abled and livelihood enhancement projects.

- (iii) Promoting gender equality, empowering women, setting up homes and hostels for women and orphans; setting up old age homes, day care centers and such other facilities for senior citizens and measures for reducing inequalities faced by socially and economically backward groups.
- (iv) Ensuring environmental sustainability, ecological balance, protection of flora and fauna, animal welfare, agroforestry, conservation of natural resources and maintaining quality of soil, air and water including contribution to the Clean Ganga Fund set-up by the Central Government for rejuvenation of river Ganga.
- (v) Protection of national heritage, art and culture including restoration of buildings and sites of historical importance and works of art; setting up public libraries; promotion and development of traditional art and handicrafts;
- (vi) Measures for the benefit of armed forces veterans, war widows and their dependents, Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) and Central Para Military Forces (CPMF) veterans, and their dependents including widows;
- (vii) Training to promote rural sports, nationally recognized sports, paralympic sports and olympic sports;
- (viii) Contribution to the prime minister's national relief fund 8[or Prime Minister's Citizen Assistance and Relief in Emergency Situations Fund (PM CARES Fund)] or any other fund set up by the central govt. for socio economic development and relief and welfare of the schedule caste, tribes, other backward classes, minorities and women;
- (ix) (a) Contribution to incubators or research and development projects in the field of science, technology, engineering and medicine, funded by the Central Government or State Government or Public Sector Undertaking or any agency of the Central Government or State Government; and (b) Contributions to public funded Universities; Indian Institute of Technology (IITs); National Laboratories and autonomous bodies established under Department of Atomic Energy (DAE); Department of Biotechnology (DBT); Department of Science and Technology (DST); Department of Pharmaceuticals; Ministry of Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha and Homoeopathy (AYUSH); Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology and other bodies, namely Defense Research and Development Organisation (DRDO); Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR); Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), engaged in conducting research in science, technology, engineering and medicine aimed at promoting Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- (x) Rural development projects;
- (xi) Slum area development;
- (xii) Disaster management, including relief, rehabilitation and reconstruction activities;
- (xiii) To contribute such other cause as may be permitted under Provisions of Companies Act, 2013 and rules made there under.

Provided that, the any projects and programs or activities that benefit only the employees of the Company and their relatives shall not be considered as CSR activities.

Also, the CSR activities undertaken in India only will be taken into consideration, in order to satisfy the requirement of section 135 of the Companies Act 2013.

Implementation process:

Stage I: Constitution and composition of the CSR Committee:

The CSR initiatives/activities of the Company will be identified and initiated by the CSR Committee comprising of 2 (two) or more members of Board.

The members of the CSR Committee shall elect one of them as the Chairman of the Committee. The CSR Committee shall recommend to the Board the amount of expenditure to be incurred by the Company on CSR activities and the Board will ensure that the activities as are included in the CSR Policy are undertaken by the Company subject to and in accordance with the provisions of section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013 and rules made there under (as amended from time to time). The composition of CSR Committee shall be disclosed in the Board's report.

Stage II: Scope of the CSR Committee

The CSR Committee has been set up to:

- Formulate and recommend to the Board CSR Policy which shall indicate the activities to be undertaken by the Company as detailed in the Section 135 read with Schedule VII to the Act and rules made there under from time to time.
- Recommend the amount of expenditure to be incurred on the activities referred to in the CSR Policy.
- Monitor the CSR Policy from time to time.
- Formulate annual action plan in pursuance of the CSR policy in accordance with the applicable law, and inclusive of the following items:
 - (a) the list of CSR projects or programmes that are approved to be undertaken in areas or, subjects specified in Schedule VII of the Act.
 - (b) the manner of execution of such projects or programmes.
 - (c) the modalities of utilization of funds and implementation schedules for the projects or programmes.
 - (d) monitoring and reporting mechanism for the projects or programmes; and
 - (e) details of need and impact assessment, if any, for the projects undertaken by the company.

Stage III: CSR EXPENDITURE:

- 1) The Company shall spend at least 2% (two percent) of average Net Profits of the Company made during the three immediately preceding financial years in accordance with the Act and the Rules and the CSR Policy.
- 2) The CSR Committee shall recommend the manner in which the CSR Expenditure shall be incurred in a year, in accordance with the Act and the Rules and the CSR Policy.

- 3) The Board shall be responsible for sanctioning the CSR Expenditure and along with the CSR Committee responsible for taking steps to ensure that the amount for the CSR Expenditure is available to the Implementation Group for application towards the CSR Activities.
- 4) Any surplus generated from CSR projects shall not be added to the normal business profits of the Company and shall be treated as follows:
- a. Ploughed back into the same project; or
- b. Transferred to an Unspent CSR Account and spent in pursuance of CSR policy and Annual Action Plan of the Company; or
- c. Transferred to a Fund specified in Schedule VII, within the prescribed timeline as specified in the CSR Rules.
- 5) In order to count towards CSR Expenditure, CSR Activities must be undertaken in compliance with the applicable laws and shall not include the following:
 - (i) activities undertaken in pursuance of normal course of business of the company any activity undertaken by the company outside India except for training of Indian sports personnel representing any State or Union territory at national level or India at international level;
 - (ii) contribution of any amount directly or indirectly to any political party under Section 182 of the Act;
 - (iii) activities benefitting employees of the company as defined in clause (k) of Section 2 of the Code on Wages, 2019 (29 of 2019);
 - (iv) activities supported by the companies on sponsorship basis for deriving marketing benefits for its products or services; and
 - (v) activities carried out for fulfilment of any other statutory obligations under any law in force in India.
- 6. The Board shall ensure that the administrative overheads shall not exceed five percent of total CSR expenditure of the Company for the financial year.

Stage IV: CSR ACTIVITIES:

The CSR Activities may be undertaken by the Company directly or through its Implementation Group or with the prior approval of the Board, through any of the following entities;

- A) "Implementation Agency" being duly registered with the Central Government and having a unique CSR Registration Number (with effect from 1 April 2021):
- (i) Company established under section 8 of Indian Companies Act 2013, or Trust, or Society registered under section 12-A and 80-G of the Income Tax Act 1961, being established by the Company, either singly or along with any other company;
- (ii) Company established under section 8 of Indian Companies Act 2013, or Trust, or Society, being established by (Indian) Central Government or (Indian) State Government;
- (iii) Company established under section 8 of Indian Companies Act 2013, or Trust, or Society registered under section 12-A and 80-G of the (Indian) Income Tax Act 1961, and having an established track record of at least three years in undertaking similar CSR activities; or

- (iv) Any entity established under an act of (Indian) Parliament or a (Indian) State Legislature.
- B) By Contributing to the Prime Minister's National Relief Fund or Chief Ministers Relief Fund or any other fund set up by the Central Government for socio-economic development and relief and welfare of the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes, other backward classes, minorities and women;
- C) By Contributing to Swatch Bharat Kosh set up by the Central Government for the promotion of Sanitation or by making contribution to the Clean Ganga Fund set up by Central Government for rejuvenation of River Ganga;
- D) By Collaborating with such other Companies which is undertaking the same or similar CSR Activities as may be decided by the CSR Committee of the Company from time to time for the purpose of having synergy of resources for the better social upliftment of the Society.

Stage V: Implementation Schedule:

- The Board shall be responsible for implementing the mandate of the CSR Policy and shall ensure that the CSR Activities are carried out in accordance with the CSR Policy read with the Act and CSR Rules and the annual action plan formulated and recommended by the CSR Committee.
- Unless the Contribution be made in the Prime Minister's National Relief Fund, Swach Bharat Kosh, the Clean Ganga Fund or such other recognized Funds of Central Government or State Government, the CSR Activities / Projects will be undertaken in the phased manner as may be determined by the CSR Committee from time to time considering the nature of activity to be undertaken at the relevant point of time.

Stage VI: Compliance, Monitoring and Reporting:

- Each Director or CSR Committee member is responsible for ensuring that the principles set out in this policy are communicated to understood and observed by all employees and for ensuring compliance in their area of responsibility.
- When the CSR projects are undertaken by contributing the CSR Funds in the Registered Society or through Registered Trust or by undertaking a joined projects with any other Organization carrying on the same / similar CSR Activities, then the periodical follow up measures and /or periodical visit to such sites supported by the progress report as received from the said Society / Trust be placed before the CSR Committee;
- The report of the Board of Directors of the Company shall include CSR activities in the prescribed format and the Company shall also display the CSR policy on its official website, if any.
